INDIA CONFERENCE

Dr. Mukundakam Sharma in his inaugural address declared that WAVES's activities are quite relevant today as they aim to enlighten us about the true knowledge of the Vedas and Sanskrit. The Vedas are storehouse of knowledge and empowerment. All the ancient civilizations have lost their existence but Indian civilization due

to its strength is existent as a source of inspiration. Rigveda belongs to the world, Yajurveda moves to higher regions, Samveda belongs to uppermost layer, and Atharvaveda is the water. Vedic *Suktas* have poetic beauty and healing effect. Gayatri is the light and power that takes man towards brightness. It is expected to purify both body and soul by means of *Yajna*. At Haridwar, various researches are carried out on medicinal herbs. We must go back to Vedas to protect nature. Management of self is required. When the worker identified himself with the organization, it leads to achievement of goals.

Prof. Radha Vallabh Tripathi appreciates the approach of WAVES for selecting the theme of the conference. He expressed his displeasure on the omission of '*Gauraiya*' bird in today's natural surroundings. Now man has separated himself from nature, while in the Vedic times he was in the vicinity of nature. The Atharvedic *rishi* affirms 'I am in nature and nature is in me'. Saraswati river is regarded as goddess Saraswati in the Vedas. Likewise nature is worshiped due to its importance and association with men. With this vision even today we can keep away all the problems related to our environment.

Prof. Bhu Dev Sharma made a power-point presentation and discussed '*Prakriti-Nature: An Analysis of Vedic & Scientific Views*'. Scientific analysis cannot give the real essence of the objects. *Samkhya* goes deep into the categorization of the principles of universe. He explained the nature of *Prakriti* according to *Samkhya* philosophy. He also referred to NASA studies to explain the concept of evolution of universe. **Mrs. Mahalakshmi Devi** began her lecture by chanting stanzas from *Saundryalahri*. Indians are following the ideals of the Yajurveda, and till *Yajnas* are being held here nothing can happen on the earth, she declared. **Prof. C. Upendra Rao** pointed out that birds and peacocks are available in natural surrounding of JNU campus.

People appreciate Vedas but what is required is that we should follow the Vedic principles. There are mantras in Avesta too. In Latin-American glossary Vedic words are popular. **Shri Rama Prasad** expressed his gratitude towards WAVES. He referred to Sringeri where *Akshat* are offered to deities which are reserved for birds only. Delivering key-note address,

Prof. Braj Bihari Chaubey indicated that the Vedas are *Anadi* and *Anant and* Vedic seers had

A brief report-10TH INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF WAVES AT BOSTON, USA

WAVES successfully held its Tenth International Conference at the University of Massachusetts, Dartmouth, MA, USA from July 13-15 2012. WAVES has attracted scholars from all over the world to its tenth conference for open discussions and scholarly presentations on topics generally related to the Vedas and Indic Studies. Scholars traveled from various parts of the world including India, Spain, Canada, Russia, and Australia. About 250 people attended this 3 day conference. There were over 160 scholarly presentations, in addition to panel discussions, keynote

speeches, and the performance of a *Havan* according to strict Vedic guidelines. Scholars talked on related topics from historical, linguistic, anthropological, gender, archeological, astronomical, philosophical and other perspectives.

Dr. David Miller, Professor of religious history at University of Toronto was very "pleased to be part of such a gathering of religious and Vedic scholars" and pledged his support if his University was chosen as the next conference venue. Waves 2012 delegates

were welcomed to UMass Dartmouth campus by Assistant Chancellor Michael Eatough, who brought a message of welcome from the Chancellor's office. Provost John Farrington also dropped by to meet and greet the delegates.

The inaugural session started with blowing of the conch which traditionally marks the auspicious beginning of an event in Vedic culture. **Prof Balram Singh**, Chair, organizing committee of the conference, and Mr. Sashi Kejriwal, President, WAVES welcomed the guests and participants. **Prof Shiva G Bajpai**, Chair of the conference, gave a brief introduction of the conference and its theme. **Prof. Rita Sherma**, Co-chair of the conference presented her views on the subject of the conference, while Pt. **Ramadheen Ramsamooj** talked about Vedic traditions in general. In the Inaugural Session, three keynote addresses were given by **Dr. Tony Nader, USA; Dr. H.R. Nagendra, Bangalore; and Prof. Shashi Tiwari,** Delhi.

The main theme of the conference as envisioned by the general Chairman of the conference, Dr. Shiva G Bajpai, Professor Emeritus at California State University was "Vedic Culture – Epic and Puranic Phase". Many scholars had their paper centered around this main theme. "This is the largest number of overseas presenters I have ever seen at any WAVES conference" observed Dhirendra Shah, a WAVES founding member and its current Treasurer. This conference was the second WAVES conference where a special track was designed for Youth presentations.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

Mr. Rajiv Malhotra's Book "Being Different" was discussed thoroughly by number of scholars in another track under five sessions.

Dr. Keith Wallace from the Maharishi Institute of Management, speaking on behalf of Dr. Tony Nader, said "Epics like Ramayana provide an insight into the human physiology, which can be used to understand and learn about oneself". Dr. R.P Singh of Jawaharlal Nehru University of Delhi said that the conference deliberations were "rich and intense all along, raising philosophical, scientific, literary and even mystical themes." Dr. Angela Mercantonio from University of Rome, La Sapienza, attending her first WAVES conference

> observed that the conference was "a good venue for international scholars from multiple disciplines to discuss varied topics keeping in mind the scientific perspective."

Dr. David Scharf, a Physicist said "The work of the WAVES organization is extremely important, not only for the academic advancement of ideas, but for the progress of society at large in a life supporting direction". Thomas Dyball, mentioned that he "heard some brilliant presentations, which greatly expanded my appreciation of

Vedic culture Dr. Bina Gupta from the University of Missouri Columbia mentioned that most conferences have a large slant towards Eurocentric concepts, and that this conference was one of the few that presented ideas from an alternative perspective. Dr. Vinod Deshmukh presented a paper on 'The Astonishing Brain and Holistic Consciousness: Neuroscience and Vedanta Perspectives'. Prof. Rama Rao Pappu found the conference "well represented and organized". Sanjay Saxena of the Gayatri Pariwar gave a wonderful demonstration of Vedic havans .

ACTIVITIES AT DELHI

ANTIQUITY AND CONTINUITY OF INDIAN CIVILIZATION AND CULTURE

24th Sept. 2012 Aryasamaj, Public School, R K Puram, New Delhi

> WAVES organized a special seminar where main speaker was Mrs. Kamlesh Kapur, USA based Educationist and Writer and the author of *Portraits of a Nation- History of Ancient India.* Prof. Sunita Singh Sengupta, Faculty of Management Studies, University of Delhi presided over the program. Prof. Bhu Dev Sharma and Dr A. K. Merchant graced the occasion with number of distinguished scholars, where as Dr. Saroj Gulati conducted the program.

> Mrs. Kamlesh Kapur presented multidisciplinary evidence taking origin of civilization in the Indian subcontinent to almost 10 millennia back when the rest of Eurasia was in the retreating Ice Age. She focused on the Earth's history to prove antiquity; she pointed out the Ganga Valley, Indus- Sarasvati valley civilizations were parallel developments with no gap proving continuity of the rise of civilization in

Ancient India. The key points of the talk were the debunking of the AIT (the mythical invasion/migration of Aryans) and scientific evidence to prove that the Ramayana and Mahabharata were historical events of great significance.

She pointed out that much of the world history has been written out of scientific context. A critical part of the proper study of historiography requires a close look at the geography, topography, elevation, latitudinal position, environment and climatic conditions and the effect of glacial activity in ancient regions and countries of the world.

In the last seven decades a wealth of new information has been constantly coming from researchers and scholars belonging to different fields of knowledge. Research in Physical sciences and Genetics, fossil studies, study of ecology of the ancient times have helped geologists, archaeologists, and historians to bring forth valuable information about the origin and evolution of early civilizations and the development of languages and cultures. As N.S. Rajaram points out- *History is no longer in the domain of social sciences*. She questioned the need for considering Greek/Roman literary sources of

Indian history. India has multiple primary sources and *ltihaasa* is an Indian tradition. Besides this oral tradition, genealogies were compiled. In Southern India, history has been written in stone.

Mrs. Kapur said that equally pertinent for arriving at some scientific and evidence based conclusions is to use new methods to learn about the people who worked the land, sailed the seas, went to war, traded, ruled and developed new ideas. Luckily, the last few decades of the 20th century saw the use of satellite imaging to scan ruins of cities under the dried bed of rivers. The artifacts thus found can now be analyzed and dated by carbon dating method. 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HARIDWAR CHAPTER

A REPORT ON PROF. BAJAJ'S LECTURE

Under the auspices of newly constituted Haridwar Chapter of WAVES, a special lecture by Prof. Madan Mohan Bajaj, Former Prof. of Physics, University of Delhi and Chancellor International Kamdhenu Ahimsa University was organized on 30th March, 2013 at Gurukul Kangri University. The topic of his talk was was "Terrestrial Problems, Bio-Medical Consequences, Cosmic Catastrophies : Latest results on BIS processes - with special reference to Vedas". In his opening remarks, Prof.Bajaj quoted Maxmuller who said that a Nation that forgets the glory of its past, loses the mainstay of its national character. He mentioned about 2008 resolution which was passed in an International Conference held in Dresden, Germany wherein it was resolved that "No country of the world should slaughter its living creatures on any pretext." While describing it Prof. Bajaj made every listener spell bound when he talked about a new subject of Human Science with the title of BISOLOGY, the knowledge of which is already available in our ancient texts. BISOLOGY is the science which deals with Breakdown of Integrated Systems in the 4 dimensional world which is now being extended to 11 dimensional world represented by modern String Theory. This universe is threatened by classical and quantum chaos commonly understood as Karmic Sidhanta in the Vedic texts. Dr.Bajaj menioned that when animals are there emerges Higgs Boson Particle or killed. electromagnetic current, which varies from animal to animal. These activities result into natural disasters like earthquakes, hurricanes, tsunamis, etc.

Therefore, it is high time that we all switch over to vegetarianism or vegan diet(plant based diet). We all should stop taking meat, alcohal, eggs and avoid leather made products. Use of leather and purchasing products of ivory, bones and heir encourages brutal killing of animals. Mathematically, BISLOAD factor represented by Z(BIS) increases on the person who consumes violent products internally or externally. Enhanced Z(BIS) factor increases the probability of diseases, catastrophy and disasters. Dr.Bajaj said that he has given numerical tables in his works to find out the probability of disasters as a function of BISLOAD. In this regard, he mentioned about a fatal car accident of Princess Dianna (wife of Prince Charles of Great Britain) who alongwith her friend sitting on the rear seat died on the spot while the driver remained unhurt. This could be explained in terms of BISLOAD theory.

Further, Dr.Bajaj stated that in the first world war around 10 million people died and after the war nearly 30 million died because of epidemics caused mainly due to use of contaminated meat (affected by H5N1 virus) which during the war days was stored under the ground. He also talked about the promising hand of BIOSOLGOY mentioning that a large number of diseases emerge due to complex

BIS processes. Quoting a senior Doctor of U.S.A, Dr.Bajaj remrked that switching over to plant based diet can save around 70% of health budget. This way, it is also possible to control three major diseases like Cancer, Alzheimer's Dementia (Loss of memory) and heart problems.

Program was well attended by a number of Scholars of Haridwar and Gurukul Kangri University. The Dean of Faculty of Oriental Studies, Prof. Vijay Pal Shastri chaired the session. Apart from Dr.Swami Divyanand, President, Haridwar Chapter of WAVES, many life members of Wider Association for Vedic Studies, such as, Professor Mahavir, Prof. Dinesh Chandra Shastri, Dr. Pratibha Shukla, Mr. Y.K. Wadhwa . Mr. Rakesh Maniktala, actively participated in the above session. This programme was also attended by several students, Dr.Deepak Kumar(Research Scholar), Shri Rishidev Arya and animal activists of Kamdhenu Ahimsa University. Late Shri Narendra Yadav showed the exhibition pertaining to atrocities on animals in Muzaffar Nagar(U.P). A new book "Natural Calamities and BIS Processes" authored by Dr.M.M. Bajaj and his team was also launched during the programme.
